She thread-painted the flower and the background using matching variegated thread on the top and backing. All the stitching was free motion and quilted on her longarm machine.

APPALACHIAN HERITAGE QUILTERS MINUTES 3/21/24

President Angie Harris brought the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m., at Crossroads Christian Church. Angie welcomed all members, visitors, and returning or visiting previous members.

The devotions were led by Chaplain Connie Browder and prayer requests were mentioned. Specifically, prayers were requested for Joyce Painter's sister and also for Joyce who is taking care of her; Betty Briscall's brother who is having cancer surgery; Connie Carr and her family upon the death of Connie's mother; Lynn Vieth's daughter is having surgery in April; Jessica Steedman's father passed away recently and her mother is struggling with the loss; Connie Falasco offered a praise that her recent gall bladder surgery was successful and she had little pain.

Upon a motion by Beverly Geissler, and seconded by Betty Tester, the minutes from the February 15, 2024, meeting were approved.

Upon a motion by Cindey Minga-Merrick, and seconded by Connie Browder, the Treasurer's Report as printed in the latest newsletter was approved.

Janet Henne has agreed to take over the work on the guild website but asks for help with Word Press and help to get her set up. Karen Campbell will talk to a friend she has at ETSU to see if he can help.

Angie stated that there is a new AHQ Information page that will be given to all new members and will be available at the sign-in table.

The By-Laws require that a nominating committee be appointed in March to recruit new officers for the upcoming year which begins in June of 2024. The slate of officers will be presented at the April meeting and will be voted on in May. Those volunteering to serve on the nominating committee for this year are Paulette Bruggerman, Zoe Sibley, and Portia Sams. All members were requested to consider serving as an officer and letting the Nominating Committee know of their willingness to serve.

Angie informed the guild that the annual drive-in retreat will be held on July 18, 19, and 20, at Crossroads Christian Church. Jessica Steedman volunteered to be the coordinator for the retreat.

The guild was also informed that the dates for the Fall Retreat at the Abingdon 4H Center are September 20-22. Cindey Minga-Merrick volunteered to coordinate this retreat. Zoe Sibley gave an update on the Consortium Sit and Sew on April 19-20. On Friday, the 19th, the times are 6:00-9:00 p.m. On Saturday the times are 9:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. If you want to participate in the Mystery Quilt there is a charge of \$5 and you must let the Consortium know that you want to participate. The supply list will be sent out a couple of weeks before the date. Also, the Consortium is sponsoring a bus trip to Keepsake Quilting and Schoolhouse Fabrics on June 11th. The cost of the trip is \$50. There are limited seats available so let the Consortium know right away if you are interested in going.

Mary Deadman informed the guild that the Quilt Show this year (2024) will be held on November 15th & 16th (Thursday - 11/12 – enter quilts and show set up; Friday and Saturday are the dates of the actual show and take down will be Saturday evening). A new show coordinator is needed – please let the nominating committee know if you are interested in coordinating the show. There is already a list of people signed up for the various subcommittees. Audrey Pantas is donating a quilt to be given away at the show. In preparation for Quilt Show 2025, Lynn Vieth introduced a project for a quilt to be made by the guild to be given away. This quilt will be hexagons made from fabrics left over from the Crafter's Corner in last year's show. At the upcoming July drive-in retreat, Vicki Lowe will teach how to make the blocks and put them together. This will be a guild project, and everyone is requested to participate.

Mountain Quiltfest in Pigeon Forge is scheduled for June 3 - 6. Our guild usually participates in the Guild Challenge and the theme for this year's challenge is Celebrate. We need at least 5 entries to enter our guild in the challenge. Zoe Sibley has volunteered to take our entries down to the show for the challenge, and Tony Grohs has volunteered to pick them up after the show. Your entries must be given to Zoe the 1st week in May. Diane Litton showed all the quilts turned in that were made from the kits distributed in the Fall. These quilts will be given to Niswonger Children's Hospital. Ballad Cancer Center, and Sleep in Heavenly Peace.

Karen Campbell reminded everyone that a Quilts of Valor sit and sew is held the 3rd Saturday of every month.

Angie Harris will present a talk on area Quilt Barns at Chester Inn in Jonesborough on Saturday, March 23 at 10:00 a.m. This is a free event. Angie will do the presentation for our guild in May.

The Fat Quarter drawing was held and 1st place was Cindey Minga-Merrick, 2nd place was Laurie Blayney, and 3rd place was Jessica Steedman. The fat quarter color for April is Blue.

Several drawings were held for fabric and sewing notions donated to the guild by former member Jolene Stratton.

There will be no Sit and Sew the first Thursday of April due to the church being unavailable on that date.

The program consisted of an exchange of Mug Rugs and Show and Tell.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
